Wednesday, January 15, 2020

- William Galvez, City Engineer: William manages city streets. He says they have 1130 miles of lanes to maintain city-wide, requiring \$20M/year to maintain, and only have a \$13M budget, including grants. Some specific topics covered during the conversation:
 - Why is Flower St. neglected? Priority is given to main artery streets and Flower is not considered one.
 - On Tuesday, the city is awarding funding to do 5 intersections on Flower and some on 19th. Funding is for the sewer under the intersections, but the intersections will get a facelift because of it.
 - Next fiscal year, the city is “hoping” to assign funding to the in-between sections of Flower.
 - The city is also presenting a map of streets up for work in the next 5 years.
 - The city listens to neighborhood input on if they want asphalt or concrete streets. Concrete requests will take longer to complete since they are more expensive.
 - There was also general conversation about re-striping crosswalks and possibly adding lighting in front of Jack Fisher Park.
 - If we put in a request, the city can let us use their speed feedback sign.
 - The city is also open to feedback on traffic flow (in particular about the Memory-Flower intersection).
